## A FEW LINES ABOUT INDONESIA AND ITS MARITIME INDUSTRY



INDONESIA is the biggest archipelago and maritime country in the world. It comprises +/- 16.304 islands, a 81,000 km coast line, 5.8 Million km<sup>2</sup> of Exclusive Economic Zone/EEZ, 300 small or large ports and a 235 million population, situated in an equatorial area between two continents, Asia and Australia.

In this strategic location with the Indian Ocean on one side and the Pacific Ocean on the other, Indonesia is on the routes of large numbers of internationally-trading foreign vessels which often layover in the country's main ports, e.g. Tanjung Priok (Jakarta), Belawan (Medan ), Tanjung Perak (Surabaya) and Makassar (Ujung Pandang).

The Port of Tanjung Priok, located in Jakarta, Indonesia's capital, is the largest and the busiest port in Indonesia. As the main port, Tanjung Priok has 14 commercial berths with a total length of around 12,568 metres. These berths are used for general, bulk and containerized cargoes from both domestic and international sources.



Based on data released by Indonesia Port Corporation II, the traffic of vessel calls through Tanjung Priok Port in 2009, 2010, and 2011 was as follows:
